ALL PLANTS ARE SHIPPED BARE ROOT. Cacti and hardier succulents are allowed to dry before they are wrapped to prevent rot in shipment. Tender leafy succulents have their roots wrapped in a paper towel moistened with antiseptic chinosol solution and plastic wrap.

Catalog Number: Please include the catalog number which appears with each plant entry in order to speed up the processing of your order.

Email Orders: At the current time we do not have a secured server and do not recommend emailing credit card numbers. If we have your credit card number on file, email us your order and include just the last 4 digits and exp. date of your credit card as verification. You may email your order and we will hold it for you until we receive payment information (via phone, fax or mail) .

Fax Orders: You may fax your order to 520-682-0480 at any time.

Foreign Orders: We cannot ship outside the United States and her territories.

Minimum order: We have no minimum order but there is a shipping charge for some orders (See Shipping Charges.)

Payment: We accept checks, money orders, Discover, Mastercard, Visa and American Express. PayPal - We accept PayPal payments. Please read the guidelines below before making your payments through PayPal.

1. Do not sent paypal payments for your order until we confirm the total cost and availability of the items.

2. Either a) Fill out our pdf order form with the email address you want billed with paypal in the credit card field,

or b) send an email with your name, shipping address, the email you want charged with paypal and the items you wish to order. Please include the quantity, catalog number, name of the item and price.

3. Once we have your order and shipping information you will be emailed an invoice and billed with paypal.

Plant Size: Unless otherwise specified, the plants will fit into the pot size indicated.

Phone Orders: (520-682-7272) We try to be available for phone orders from noon-5pm Mon-Fri. We are often available more than that, but avoid calling before 7am or after 7pm.

Plant lists and mailings: We do 3 major updates of the web site per year and send out our plant lists at that time.

Processing Time: We try to pull the plants for your order within a day of receiving it and process and ship within a week. We ship on Monday and Tuesday so that the order will arrive in that week. If you do not receive your order within four weeks of sending it, please notify us -- the United States Postal Service is not infallible.

Sales Tax: For orders by Arizona residents or shipped to Arizona please add 6.1% for state sales tax.

Shipping and Weather: While we ship all year and pack the plants to protect them from some cold, we cannot guarantee that they will not be damaged from prolonged freezing temperatures. If you order during the winter months, take your weather conditions into consideration.

Postal Carrier Release allows the postal carrier to deliver a large parcel to your residence when they would not otherwise.

Substitutes: We do our best to provide the plants you order, but some quantities are limited. If you list substitutes we can select plants of equal or greater value; or if you prefer, we can give you credit toward your next order or a refund. If you are paying by credit card, you will be charged only for the plants that are available.

When Your Order Arrives: After bare-rooting your plants, we allow a day or so for the roots to heal before packing them. They will be ready to pot as soon as it is convenient for you. When you receive your order, unpack it immediately. If any plants are damaged, please notify us. (WARNING- Cacti and succulents are dangerous if treated improperly. Plants in the Euphorbiaceae and the Apocynaceae have irritating or toxic sap. Many of the succulents are armed with an array of spines, thorns, and other protective structures which can cause physical injury. The customer assumes all responsibility for handling our plants with care.)

A WORD ABOUT GRAFTED PLANTS

We produce all of our own grafts and are always trying to improve them. We prefer *Harrisia jusbertii* & *Stenocereus griseus* for grafting cacti because they are long lived and have a longer growing season than many other species. There is no universal grafting stock, however, so we will be using other species that are found to be superior for specific applications. By grafting we can provide you with rare plants at a reasonable price.

ACANTHOCALYCIUM glaucum - #8115 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary miniature blue-green stem with short stiff black spines, bright yellow flowers

***ARIOCARPUS aff. trigonus El Olmo NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9538 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - olive green tubercles form low open rosette, flowers range from white to yellow to pink**

A. fissuratus ssp. bravoanus (LIMIT 5) - #8676 - .65"seedlings - \$15.00 - SLP, MX, dwarf southern subspecies, upright rough dark green tubercles form small rosette 3"-4" across, light pink flower in fall, these are very close to flowering size

A. retusus Mina San Rafael form - #6898 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - dwarf form of A. retusus, gray-green tubercles are narrow and rosettes only grow to about 6" across, white flowers when mature, many of these are flowering size

A. retusus v. furfuraceus (LIMIT 5) - #5098 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - Las Tablas, SLP, MX, generic tubercle shapes that tend to have fairly fat gray-green tubercles eventually forming a stem more than 8" in diameter, large white flowers in the fall when mature

A. retusus v. furfuraceus 'Pointy' - #9717 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - phenotype from Las Tablas, SLP, MX selectively bred, gray-green tubercles with fat base that tapers to a sharp narrow point, white flowers in fall when mature

A. retusus v. furfuraceus 'Pointy' LARGER SIZE (LIMIT 2) - #9717.3 - 3.25"pot - \$25.00 - phenotype from Las Tablas, SLP, MX selectively bred, gray-green tubercles with fat base that tapers to a sharp narrow point, white flowers in fall when mature, these are close to flowering size

A. retusus ssp. panarottoi (LIMIT 3) - #9342 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - low rosette of green-gray tubercles as long as wide, tubercle edges have a thicker "rolled" edge when larger, flowers white or with a little blush of pink

***A. retusus ssp. pectinatus (LIMIT 3) - #8820 - .7"seedling - \$15.00 - a few more back in stock, dwarf form with narrow gray tubercles, areoles of mature plants are elongated with a line of short spines, white flowers when plants are about 1.5" across**

A. retusus ssp. retusus (LIMIT 5) - #5443 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - southern form of this species, long gray tubercles form solitary stems up to 10" in diameter, white flowers in fall when mature

A. retusus ssp. retusus "scaphirostroides" (LIMIT 5) - #5445 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - upright narrow gray-green tubercles, solitary low stem grows to 8" or more, white flowers when mature

A. trigonus (LIMIT 3) - #5102 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - forms a low rosette of stiff olive-green tubercles that curve up and inward like claws, large yellow flower in the fall when mature

***A. trigonus ssp. horacekii NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9130 - 1"seedling - \$10.00 - already flowering size, dwarf subspecies with smaller olive green tubercles but same large yellow flower, grows to about 6"**

ASTROPHYTUM capricorne v. capricorne - #5448 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - round dark green 8-ribbed stem eventually becoming shortly columnar, moderately covered in tan to whitish flecking, thin curved dark brown spines, large yellow flower with orange center

A. capricorne v. niveum aff. nudum (LIMIT 5) - #9224 - 1.5"plant - \$5.00 - stem mostly without flecking, develops 1"+ very stout curved yellow to black spinesn mature, large yellow flower has orange center

***A. coahuilense (LIMIT 2) - #9907 - 1.4"plant - \$5.00 - Lerdo, Coahuila, MX, round 5-ribbed stems with dense fine white flecking, eventually shortly columnar, yellow flower with orange center**

***A. myriostigma (LIMIT 3) - #9673 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - from North of Las Palomas, SLP MX, five-ribbed stem with fine flecking as seedling, produces more ribs as mature plant, yellow flowers when mature**

***A. myriostigma "nudum" (LIMIT 3) - #5451- 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - five-ribbed stem, dark green, no white flecking, yellow flower when larger**

***A. myriostigma v. strongylogonum NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9846 - 1.5"seedling - \$5.00 - Villar, SLP, MX, large-growing variety, dense fine flecking, small light yellow flowers**

ECHINOCACTUS parryi (LIMIT 3) - #8760 - 1.25"seedling - \$8.00 - rarely available species, solitary blue-green stem, deep sharp ribs, stout tan and reddish spines, yellow flower with red center when mature

***ECHINOCEREUS carmenensis (LIMIT 2) - #9246 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary shortly columnar green stem wrapped in short yellow and reddish spines, off-yellow flower scented of chocolate and citrus**

***E. ledingii (LIMIT 3) - #5292 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - from southeastern Arizona, upright green stems with erect yellow spines, pink flowers when mature**

E. nivusus (LIMIT 3) - #5296 - 1.2" tall plant - \$5.00 - soft green stem covered in dense stiff white spines, will cluster in time, shy to flower but has large light purple flowers when it does

***E. pacificus (LIMIT 3) - #5297 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - from Baja, CA, green stems will form clusters to 12" or more, erect straw-colored spines with darker tips, bright red tubular flower in summer when mature**

E. reichenbachii (miniature form) (LIMIT 5) - #8872 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary club-shaped stem densely covered in short tan spines, large tricolored flower, pink then white and red in the center

E. reichenbachii v. baileyi (LIMIT 3) - #9328 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - (Altus, OK) upright green stems, dense white and orange spines, light pink flower

***E. reichenbachii v. perbellus (LIMIT 3) - #9373 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - Crane Co. TX, somewhat conical green stem, dense short, semi-erect white spines with black tips gives a shaggy look, pale pink flower**

***E. scheeri ssp. gentryi (LIMIT 3) - #5315 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - seedlings starting to cluster, finger-thick almost spineless dark green stems, large pink flower with long tube**

E. viereckii ssp. morricalii (LIMIT 2) - #5294 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - clustering mostly spineless, often wrinkled bright green stems, large dark pink flowers

For other species included in Echinopsis also see: Acanthocalycium, Lobivia, Soehrensia, Trichocereus

ECHINOPSIS melanopotamicum - #7652 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - solitary dark green upright stem, stout gray/black spines, central spines longer when mature, long-tubed white nocturnal flower

***E. subdenudata 'Fuzzy Navel' (LIMIT 3) - #8705 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - round matte green stem, spineless fuzzy areoles, long-tubed white flowers in summer**

***E. calorubra NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9078 - 1.25"plant - \$5.00 - flattened shiny dark green solitary stem, short curved yellow spines, large long-tubed red flowers**

DUE TO A GENETIC ANALYSIS BY GUERRERO ET AL. 2019, WE NOW RECOGNIZE THE INCLUSION OF THESE GENERA INTO ERIOSYCE: HORRIDOACTUS, ISLAYA, NEOPORTERIA, PYRRHOACTUS

ERIOSYCE heinrichiana ssp. setosiflora - #7938 - 1.5"plant - \$6.00 - shortly columnar solitary dark green to brownish stem, almost spineless stem when small, develops erect black spines when mature, this line have brownish flowers

E. napina ssp. lembkei (LIMIT 3) - #9473 - .8"seedling - \$6.00 - club-shaped brownish-green stem on thick taproot, short tan spines, light yellow flowers

E. recondita ssp. vexata - #9406 - 1.25"plant - \$6.00 - shortly columnar solitary dark green to brownish stem, spineless when small but develops spines when mature, yellow flowers

FEROACTUS acanthodes NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9943 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - this batch of seedlings have blonde and red spines, leaning more towards the lighter colored spines, hooked central spines

***F. emoryi ssp. rectispinus (LIMIT 3) - #9868 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - West of San Francisco del la Sierra, BCS, stout gray-green body, columnar to several feet when mature, red and grayish spines, central spines on mature plants can grow to more than 4" long**

F. fordii - #7561 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - small-growing species from Baja, CA, dark green stem, stout tan and brown spines age to gray, violet flowers in later winter, will flower at a little over 3"

***F. glaucescens 'inermis' (LIMIT 3) - #7050 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - light green stems with few thin yellow spines, as they mature they will stop producing spines, small yellow flowers when larger**

F. herrerae - #9882 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - SW of Quiriego, SON, MX, solitary club-shaped green stem as seedling, stout columnar body when mature, tan to red-brown spines with hooked central spines, yellow to orange flower when mature

F. latispinus (LIMIT 3) - #5499 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low solitary shiny dark green stem with sharp ribs, red and yellow radial spines, stout hooked central spine, light purple flowers in early spring

***F. pottsii (LIMIT 3) - #9074 - 4"pot - \$10.00 - matte green stem, sparse erect tan spines, forms large round stem, yellow flowers when mature**

F. schwarzii - #6847 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary round green stem with sharp ribs, thick stiff yellow spines, yellow flowers when mature, stem grows to more than 12" across

***F. wislizenii (yellow-spined) - #9452 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - from yellow-spined plants in the Tucson area, yellow flowers, otherwise typical growth for this large green-stemmed barrel cactus with hooked central spines**

FRAILEA tenuissima v. albisetia - #9650 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low green stem with short yellow spines, clusters eventually, yellow flowers

GLANDULOCACTUS uncinatus ssp. wrightii (LIMIT 3) - #9600 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - (aka Ancistrocactus unc. & Sclerocactus unc.) (Carlsbad, NM) shortly upright blue-green tuberculate stem, red and yellow spines, four hooked spines per areole, red-brown flowers

Gymnocactus - see Turbinicarpus

GYMNOCALYCIUM baldianum (LIMIT 3) - #5505 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary low light green stem, short tan spines held close to the body, bright orange to red flowers

G. bruchii ssp. bruchii (LIMIT 3) - #5507 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - low gray-green stem with soft white spines held close to the body, will cluster, pale pink flowers in the spring, plants are female or male but these have not been sexed

G. damsii v. tucavocense (LIMIT 3) - #7870 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary flattened green stem with some purple on the "chins", short erect tan spines, light pink flowers for much of the growing season, flowering size

G. ferrarii - #7932 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low purplish-green stem with brownish spines held close, light pink flowers

***G. griseopallidum (LIMIT 2) - #8537 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - low light green body with sharp ribs, sparse erect tan spines, off-white flower**

G. lukasikii (LIMIT 3) - #9577 - 1.25"plant - \$5.00 - a few more back in stock, low soft purple to green stem, short light spines held close, light pink flowers

G. marianae (LIMIT 3) - #9900 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - low solitary gray-green stem, short yellowish spines erect or held close, large bright red flowers, closely related to G. baldianum

G. marsoneri - #9878 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - low dark green stem with thick gray-brown spines held close, light pink flower

G. morroense - #9901 - 1.4"plant - \$5.00 - miniature gray-green stem from thick taproot, thin off-white spines mostly held close, off-pink flowers

G. neuhuberi (LIMIT 3) - #8440 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - shiny green tuberculate stem, short erect yellow spines, light pink flowers

G. schatzlianum - #8213 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low gray-green body, short tan spines, large light yellow flower, flowering size

G. triacanthum (LIMIT 3) - #5688 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low dark olive green stem, 3-5 short tan spines held close to the body, whitish flowers

HAMATOCACTUS hamatacanthus v. davisii (LIMIT 3) - #9038 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - (= Ferocactus) solitary light green tuberculate stem, thin straw-colored radial spines, long hooked central spines, yellow flower when mature

***HOMALOCEPHALA texensis NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9849 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - Roswell, NM, when mature has thick ribs with stout spines and erect central spines, large pink flower with darker center (this image is a generic seed grown specimen, not from Roswell NM)**

HORRIDOCACTUS - see ERIOSYCE

ISLAYA - see ERIOSYCE

LEUCHTENBERGIA principis - #5517 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - genetically belongs with Ferocactus and Leuchtenbergia is older, so Ferocactus should be Leuchtenbergia, but either way this is an unusual species, long blue-green tubercles with a triangular cross-section tipped with long papery yellow spines, large yellow flower, large taproot on mature plants can be raised for effect

LOBIVIA leucomalla - #5687 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - eventually columnar dark green stem densely covered in glassy white spines, large yellow flowers in summer

L. longispina - #7951 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - this is supposedly a form of L. ferox, which is quite variable, low solitary shiny light green body, long tan central spines with small hook, large bright pink flower, flowering size, some scars on lower side of the stem

L. pojoensis v. grandiflora - #5520 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - (= L. calorubra) low shiny dark green solitary stem, short straw-colored spines, large dark red flower, just flowering size, some scars on lower side of the stem

L. prestoana - #7885 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - a form of L. cinnabarina, very low green stem, short curved yellowish spines, large bright red flowers

L. purpureomineata - #8435 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - green stems cluster from base, short tan spines, large dark reddish flowers

L. schreiteri - #8775 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low dark green stem from thick taproot forms small clusters, brown spines, clear red flowers

***L. teigeliana v. castanae (LIMIT 3) - #8124 - 1.25"plant - \$5.00 - low dark green stem clusters with age, short curved red and yellow spines held close, dark pink flowers**

L. winteriana - #7236 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - solitary egg-shaped stem, short light brown spines, large bright pink flowers

MALACOCARPUS erinaceus - #9833 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - (also found as Notocactus and Parodia) low dark green solitary stem, short tan spines with dark tips, large bright yellow flowers, flowering size

MAMMILLARIA albilanata ssp. fauxiana - #5522 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low stem covered in short dense yellow spines, small reddish flowers in spring

***M. aurielanata (LIMIT 2) - #7254 - 3.25"pot - \$10.00 - solitary soft dark green body on thick taproot, web of soft golden hairs, light pinkish flowers, somewhat rot prone**

M. bombycina - #5526 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - upright light green stem with white radial spines and hooked brown central spine, light pink flowers in spring, can make impressive clusters in time

M. boolii - #7263 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - from Baja California, soft egg-shaped light blue-green solitary stem, white radial spines, brown hooked central spines, large light pink flower in spring

M. camptotricha (LIMIT 3) - #6918 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - Bird's Nest, low dark green body with long thin tubercles tipped with long straw-colored spines, small yellow flowers almost get lost in the thatch of spines

M. camptotricha cv. 'Bru' NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9854 - 3.25"potG-HJ - \$10.00 - 1.2" grafted offset, very short thick golden spines, dark green body, small whitish flowers, will cluster in time

M. fraileana - #8223 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - from the southern end of Baja, CA, upright clustering green stems, gray and black spines, hooked central spines, light pink flowers in summer

M. glassii ssp. ascensionis - #9902 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - small stems with dense white radial spines and short dark hooked central spines, clusters freely, pink flowers

M. hahniana ssp. woodsii NEW (LIMIT 3) - #7363 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - mostly solitary stem to 6" in diameter and shortly columnar, dense short black-tipped white spines, white radial spines, short white hair from the axils, rings of bright pink flowers in late winter

***M. heyderi ssp. macdougalii (LIMIT 2) - #9877 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - Ruby Road, Santa Cruz Co., AZ, flattened dark green stem grows to 6" or more in diameter, erect reddish brown central spine as juvenile but not when mature, short gray-brown radial spines, rings of light yellow flowers when mature**

***M. lauii fma. subducta (LIMIT 3) - #7306 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - low green stem with dense yellowish erect spines and pink flowers in the winter**

M. lloydii (LIMIT 3) - #7307 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - closely related to Mam. sempervivi, flattened green stem on thick taproot, short paired spines, light yellowish flower, red fruit when mature

***M. longiflora ssp. stampferi - #6916 - 1.25"plant - \$5.00 - round green stem, white radial spines and red hooked central spines, large light pink flower**

M. longimamma ssp. longimamma - #6791 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - green stem will develop huge tubercles, thick taproot, 1.5"-wide lemon-scented flowers, can make a large cluster

M. magnimamma "krameri" - #8513 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - dark green stems with stout tubercles eventually forms sizeable clusters, stout curved tan spines with black tips, pink flowers

M. magnimamma "priesnitzii" - #5550 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low shiny dark green stem, short stout black and white spines, reddish flowers in late winter, wooly axils

M. mixtecensis (LIMIT 3) - #9106 - 1.25"plant - \$5.00 - a form of M. mystax, round dark green bodies, black spines, central spines occasionally long, rings of bright red/pink flowers larger than typical M. mystax in spring when mature

***M. perbella (LIMIT 3) - #5548 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low green stem branches dichotomously, short tan radial spines held close to the stem, minute black-tipped central spines, small pink flowers in the winter, flowering size**

***M. picta (LIMIT 3) - #9653 - 1"+seedling - \$6.00 - L1063, Aramberri, Nuevo Leon, MX, low soft dwarf dark green body, short slightly plumose tan radial spines, small yellow flowers, can make small clusters with age, flowering size**

M. sempervivi (LIMIT 3) - #6919 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - low solitary dark green stem, short whitish spines held close, pink flowers in spring

M. senilis (LIMIT 3) - #7339.2 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - round green stem covered in erect glassy white spines with hooked central spines, huge dark red flowers in late spring

M. scheideana - #5555 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - flattened dark green stem on thick root, soft short golden spines held close to the body, yellow flowers

M. schwarzii (LIMIT 2) - #5702 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - soft green body covered in short soft white spines, small white flowers, forms small cluster

***M. solisioides (LIMIT 3) - #7340 - 2.25"pot - \$6.00 - solitary green stem covered in dense short yellow spines held close to the stem, yellow flowers in winter**

M. spinosissima - #5781 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - upright green stem, dense erect red-tipped white spines, rings of dark pink flowers in spring

***M. stella-de-tacubaya NEW (LIMIT 3) - #9195 - .9"-1"plant - \$5.00 - closely related to the M. lasiacantha complex, small round stem with dense sandy-colored radial spines, hooked central spines that often stop as plant matures, whitish flowers with dark midstripe in spring**

M. tesopacensis v. rubraflora - #8804 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - a form of M. sonorensis, dark green stems cluster in time, erect chestnut spines, red flowers

M. theresae - #7355 - 1"tall seedling - \$10.00 - flowering size miniature, soft purplish stem on thickened root, tubercles topped with feathery white spines held close to the stem, 1" pink flower with long tube, seeds stay inside plant trickling out over many years

MOMORDICA rostrata (LIMIT 5) (CURCUBITACEAE) - #5746 - .5"wide x 1.3"tall seedling - \$6.00 - caudiciform cucurbit from NE Africa, in cultivation it makes a pleated teardrop shaped caudex with leafy vines during the summer, small unisexual yellow flowers, soft bright orange fruit, 9 to 1 male to female ratio, these are too small to flower so there is no way to sex them,

***PACHYPODIUM succulentum (LIMIT 3) (APOCYNACEAE) - #7445.3 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - pencil-thick green stem from thick carrot-like taproot, long narrow green leaves, small brown spines, large pink flowers**

PELARGONIUM carnosum NEW - #8322 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - winter grower from northern and western South Africa, thick gray-green stem with dissected gray-green leaves, small white flowers

***P. crithmifolium NEW (LIMIT 2) - #9851 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - from southern Namibia and northwestern South Africa, thick green stems branch to form low shrubs, finely dissected scented green leaves, small pink and white flowers, this species tends to have separate male and female plants**

P. klinghartense NEW - #8484 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - winter-growing caudiciform, from the Klinghardt Mountains in Namibia and northwestern South Africa, thick chalky gray-green stems, fleshy blue-green leaves (which tend to break off when handled), small white flowers when mature, this species tends to have separate male and female plants

PLEIOSPILOS nelii (AIZOACEAE) - #7463 - 2.25"pot - \$4.00 - fat paired leaves with minute dots form a round body, large unscented orange flowers

RABBIEA difformis (AIZOACEAE) - #8209 - 2.25"pot - \$4.00 - small clusters of upright dark green pointed leaves, large yellow flowers, very cold hardy

SANSEVIERIA ballyi (ASPARAGACEAE) - #9133 - 3.25"pot - \$7.00 - (Sansevieria is now been moved to Dracaena), one of the smaller species, rosettes of sharply pointed mottled white and green leaves, plant spreads by runners, will produce stalks of heavily scented white flowers

TRICHODIADEMA densum (AIZOACEAE) - #6797 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - short branching stems, soft dark green leaves tipped with white spiny crown, roots thicken in time and can be raised, large bright pink flowers in spring

TUMAMOCA macdougallii (CUCURBITACEAE) - #8526.2 - 2.25"pot - \$5.00 - native from southern Arizona to Sonora Mexico, mature plants have white underground lobed caudex, annual vines with dissected leaves, small white flowers and red fruit in summer

UNCARINA roeoesliana NEW (LIMIT 3) (PEDALIACEAE) - #7798 - 3.25"pot - \$8.00 - smallest of the genus that can flower in a 3.25" pot, making low shrub to 3' tall with thick roots that can be raised, fuzzy light green leaves, 1"+ yellow flowers, fruit with 4-pronged barbs

YUCCA endlichiana (ASPARAGACEAE) - #8489 - 3.25"pot - \$10.00 - Coahuila, MX, upright blue-green leaves grow to about 12" long, root thickens and spreads out over the ground over time, flowers borne on short stalks less than 8" tall so that fleshy fruit are almost at ground level
